ORDINANCE NUMBER ~~54~~ SERIES 2005
AN ORDINANCE REGARDING THE USE OF THE CITY PARK

WHEREAS, the mayor and Commissioners of the City of Kingsley, Kentucky, have the authority pursuant to statute to enact Ordinances relating to the City, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Commissioners deem it necessary to regulate the use of the city park,
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF KINGSLEY THAT:

Section 1. The city park is a place where the public may gather from time to time. While ordinary use of the city park is encouraged and welcome, if there is a public gathering at which 25 persons or more are expected to gather, an application for a park use permit shall be submitted to the City Clerk for approval of that use. No use of the city park is permitted if such use involves a public gathering at which 200 persons or more are gathered.

Section 2. The City Clerk shall supply an application form for park use. Said application form shall solicit the following information from the applicant:

- a. Applicant's name, address, phone number and e-mail address (if available).
- b. Date of the public gathering in the park and the hours thereof including time for set up and clean up. Set up time shall not begin more than 6 (six) hours prior to the event. Clean up shall be completed no later than 12 hours after the end of the event;
- c. Expected number of people who will attend the public gathering at the park and plans for regulation of traffic flow and parking;
- d. The provisions that the applicant has made for policing the public gathering at the park and plans for regulation of traffic flow and parking;
- e. Written proof from the insurance carrier who will be providing liability coverage and the amount of coverage that will be provided to the City; the minimum amount of \$1,000,000.00 is mandatory;
- f. Use of the park watering system is prohibited;
- g. Whether any tents, canopies, tables, chairs or any other personal/rental property will be brought into the park, and if so, whether the tents or canopies will have floors;
- h. Whether the persons or persons who will be policing the public gathering at the park are police officers or volunteers, and,
- i. A description of the sanitary facilities, IF ANY, THAT will be available to the persons who will be attending the public gathering at the park.
- j. Electricity is available.

Section 3. The application for the permit shall be submitted with a \$10.00 filing fee and a \$1,000.00 bond to insure that the park will be free from damage and/or debris following the gathering. Upon receipt of the application for the permit, containing the information required in Section 2 of this ordinance, and the filing fee and bond, the City Clerk shall, at the next regular meeting of the City Commissioners, submit said application for consideration by the Commissioners. PRIOR TO THE EVENT A DESIGNATED COMMISSIONER SHALL INSPECT THE PARK WHILE ACCOMPANIED BY THE APPLICANT OR A DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVE OF THE APPLICANT. A DESIGNATED CITY COMMISSIONER SHALL BE NOTIFIED BY THE PERMIT HOLDER THAT THE EVENT HAS BEEN CONCLUDED AND THE AREA HAS BEEN CLEANED, THE DESIGNATED CITY COMMISSIONER SHALL INSPECT THE PARK IMMEDIATELY UPON NOTIFICATION, AND, IF THE AREA IS CLEAN AND IN THE CONDITION IT WAS PRIOR TO THE EVENT, THE BOND WILL BE RETURNED TO THE PERMIT HOLDER.

Section 4. If, in the opinion of the majority of the City Commissioners, the granting of the permit applied for would in no way adversely affect the public health, morals, safety, or general welfare of the community, the City Clerk shall be instructed to issue the requested permit.

Section 5. Regular meetings of the City Commissioners shall be exempted from the requirements of this ordinance.

Section 6. No alcoholic beverages may be consumed on public property within the city limits, including, but not limited to, the city park. No inflatable bouncers, slides, jump houses or similar apparatus may be set up or used in the city park.


Section 7. Failure to comply with any section of this ordinance shall constitute a violation of this ordinance. Violations of this ordinance shall be an offense. Each offense shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$250.00 and said fine shall not exceed \$500.00.

This Ordinance shall become effective upon its passage and publication.
