## They're Ba—ack.....

*Brood X Cicadas*

### What are they:

There are many types of cicadas, Brood X is the larger version that visits the Ohio Valley west of Cincinnati every 17 years.



This year you can expect to hear them make their mating calls and see their molted brown shell hanging onto vertical surfaces from late April through June. Mostly harmless (but annoyingly noisy) to humans and pets, Brood X can do some serious damage to smaller trees and woody bushes. After mating, the females make slits in woody branches 1/4 to 1/2" in diameter and lay batches of eggs. Twigs break at these weak spots and are left to dangle, turn brown and die. This "pruning" is not a serious problem for large trees but can adversely affect the developing structure of small trees or woody bushes. Also, eggs inserted in the slit will remain in the twigs for six to 10 weeks before hatching. The tiny nymphs then fall to the ground and burrow into the soil in search of tree roots. They use their piercing-sucking mouthparts to take sap from tree roots, which can also adversely affect young trees for years to come. Cicadas are not drawn to pine trees, or any tree that has a gummy sap.

### What do you need to do:

Insecticides are fairly ineffective in protecting a tree, but it is recommended young trees be covered with 1/4" netting or cheesecloth. As soon as the first mating calls are heard, secure the covering around the trunk to prevent cicadas from climbing up to the limbs. The netting should be removed at the end of June or when cicada activity stops.

Home improvement stores such as Lowe's or Home Depot have 1/4" netting, and craft stores such as Hobby Lobby have cheesecloth. You can buy either online. If you need help securing the netting/cloth, contact:

## Junkyard Easements—Not

*Clean Disposal of Your Big Stuff*

If you're cleaning out your home and have furniture, mattresses, appliances, or any large item that won't fit in your trash can, you have several options for getting rid of the stuff:

1-Take a picture of your item and post it on Next Door under FREE ITEMS. You keep the item in your home or garage and people contact you to arrange a date and time for pick up in your driveway. If the pickup doesn't happen, move the item back to your home or garage. This has been a great tool for many of us to unload stuff from our homes....or get free stuff we think we need. 2-Call Waste Management for a large item pickup and bring the item to the city easement on Monday. Ideally, make the call by Friday to give them time to schedule the pickup. Tell them you are calling for **City of Kingsley**, then give them your name and street address. If it's anything with cloth, like a mattress, box springs, couch, ottoman, etc, you have to cover it with plastic and tape up all the seams. (This is a recent requirement to protect the haulers from bedbugs. We don't have bedbugs, but they don't know that.) WM will pick up one item per week if you call them. If you have additional items, they will charge you \$75 for every 15 minutes the pickup men are at your easement. You can get plastic paint drop cloths at any home improvement or paint store. DO NOT put a large item in the city easement until you have scheduled WM or a private pick up service date. The number for Waste Management is:

If you leave large items in your easement, any time other than Monday evenings through Tuesday evenings, you will be fined. The first violation is \$100, follow up violations start at \$500. Don't risk it!
